## Media Center—Elementary School

#### The Need for Media Centers

Today's media center is more than just a library. It also functions as a welcoming, student-owned common area that's great for collaborative work, independent study, technology or even maker activities. The media center should incorporate furnishings that allow it to serve multiple purposes—from reading and studying to group projects to distance learning. Furniture should be mobile, flexible, and easily arranged into various configurations as needed.

### Requirements for a Great Media Center

For **students**, the media center should feature tables or study carrels in a quiet place for students that need a place for independent work, as well as collaborative tables that can be easily arranged for group work. Technology should be easily accessible and situated on tables with grommet holes or other wire management systems to keep cables out of the way.

For **teachers**, the best media center includes flexible furniture and comfortable seating to encourage students to spend more time there. Storage areas should be accessible and easy-to-use, so supplies are easy to find, distribute or collect.

**Administrators** require a media center that's furnished with products that work together to accomplish the vision for the space. They need to know that all products are available at the time they are needed and that their order will arrive correctly and on time. Installations must be quick and efficient.

- Collaborative tables
- School chairs

**Collaborative tables** feature spacious work surfaces that are still compact enough to allow team members to reach the materials that they need for projects. The table shapes are designed to let all students see each other, giving everyone an equal opportunity to participate. Thick tabletops withstand heavy use, and laminate surfaces clean easily.

**School chairs** are constructed from durable, reinforced plastic that supports students as they lean back. The smooth, antistatic seats don't require a metal backrest, which means students won't snag hair or clothing on exposed rivets. The lightweight design makes it easy for students to pick them up and move them around the room.

The **Individual Focus Area** gives students a quiet place to work independently on assignments or study for an exam. This area includes:

- Soft seating
- Soft seating tabletops
- . Soft chairs with tablets
- Powered tabletop
- Bookcase

Soft seating features thick padding, so students stay comfortable as they study, read or work on devices.

Soft seating tabletops provide a sturdy work surface for writing or propping up study materials.

**Soft chairs with tablets** are perfect for long study sessions since the provide both comfortable seating and a built-in work surface to hold notebooks or devices.

A powered tabletop gives students access to outlets for charging devices as well as an extra work surface.

A bookcase holds reference materials, textbooks or supplies for students to use while studying.

The Computer Workstation Area accommodates the use of technology during study or assignments. This area includes:

- · Computer tables
- Stools
- Charging cart

**Computer tables** offer a spacious surface for students to work on desktops or devices while spreading out notebooks or other project materials. Grommet holes keep wires and cables out of the way.

**Stools** give students freedom of movement as they focus on their activities, and the backless seats promote good posture and strengthen core muscles.

A **charging cart** keeps devices charged and ready for use. Locking doors keep them secure overnight. Heavy-duty rolling casters easily maneuver over any flooring, and the top doubles as an additional surface for storage or presentation.
